The Core Competencies published by the National Association for Court Management equip court leaders with knowledge, skills, and abilities (KSAs) to support excellence in the administration of justice.

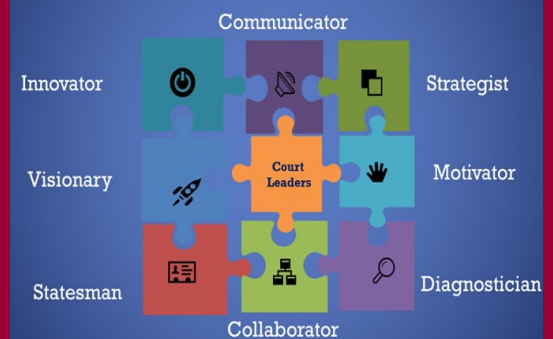
Leadership in courts is critical. It involves not just a position, but processes and actions, coupled with traits and behaviors to support operations and vision.
